NATIONAL TROPHY

USEF Jumper Rating 2

National competition classes are open to junior and amateur riders. Entries are limited to 40 riders on a first come first serve basis. Acceptance is not confirmed until entry and fees are paid in full. Riders and horses may not cross enter in Prestige or Masters classes. Riders and horses may compete at both the 1.10m - 1.15 and 1.20m - 1.25m height. Riders may compete a maximum of two horses per class. Horses may start a maximum of one class per day with the exception of horses competing in the Pro-Am Style & Competition on Saturday evening (Participation is by special invitation). Horses may not cross enter in National, Prestige and Masters classes.

1. \$1,925 - 2 phases time differed - Thursday, September 29

Class to be run according to FEI Article 274.5.6. First part: Table A, not against the clock, with time allowed, over 7 to 9 fences (combinations authorized). Second part: Table A against the clock, open to any horse having finished the first part without elimination or retirement over 5 to 6 fences (eventually one combination). Ranking according to the penalties of the two parts and time of the second part. In the event of equality for first place, the tied Athletes will be paced equal first. Maximum fence height is 1.10m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map.

2. \$1,925 - 2 phases time differed - Thursday, September 29

Class to be run according to FEI Article 274.5.6. First part: Table A, not against the clock, with time allowed, over 7 to 9 fences (combinations authorized). Second part: Table A against the clock, open to any horse having finished the first part without elimination or retirement over 5 to 6 fences (eventually one combination). Ranking according to the penalties of the two parts and time of the second part. In the event of equality for first place, the tied Athletes will be paced equal first. Maximum fence height is 1.20m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map.

The Prestige Trophy is open to professionals, amateurs and juniors. Entries are limited to 45 riders o a first come, first serve basis. Acceptance is not confirmed until entries and fees have been paid in full. Athletes must also enter via their National Federation.

Maximum of two horses per rider. Each horse is allowed a maximum of four starts, except for horses participating in the Charity class on Saturday evening (participation in the charity class is by special invitation by the OC). A rider and horses entered in a category (CSI 5* or CSI 2*) can only participate in the classes of this category. One groom per athlete.

1. **\$3,500 - International competition "2 Phases Time Differed" - Thursday, September 29** Class will be run according to FEI Article 274.5.6. First part: Table A, not against the clock, with time allowed, over 7 to 9 fences (combination authorized). Second part: Table A against the clock, open to any horse having finished the first part without elimination or retirement, over 5 to 6 fences (eventually one combination). Ranking according to the penalties of the two parts and time of the second part. Maximum fence height is 1.35m. Time allowed to be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money to be awarded using FEI Prize Money Chart 1 with \$75 to be awarded to the athlete placed 13th.

2. \$34,600 - Table A against the clock - Thursday, September 29

Class to be run according to FEI Article 238.2.1. Maximum fence height is 1.45m. Time allowed to be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money to be awarded using FEI Prize Money Chart 1 with \$100 to the 13th placed athlete.

Qualification for the Longines Speed Challenge: The 5 best CSI 2* riders in this class are qualified for the Longines Speed Challenge (Open class for CSI 5* Riders and the 5 best CSI 2* riders of Class 2) on Friday evening. If one of the 5 best riders decides not to participate, the 6th rider will be invited. If a 2nd rider decides not to participate, the 7th rider of the competition will be invited, and so forth. See the Masters Trophy class descriptions for Longines Speed Finals specifications.

3. \$6,000 Accumulator with Joker - Friday, September 30

Class to be run according to FEI Article 269.5. Maximum fence height is 1.35m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money will be awarded according to the FEI Prize Money Chart 1 with \$75 to the athlete placed 13th.

4. \$34,600 Table A with jump-off - Friday, September 30

Class to be run according to FEI Article 238.2.2. Maximum fence height is 1.45m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money will be awarded according the FEI Prize Money Chart 1 with \$100 to the athlete placed 13th.

5. \$7,500 Table A against the clock - Saturday, October 1

Class to be run according FEI Article 238.2.1. Maximum fence height is 1.40m. Time allowed to be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money to be awarded using the FEI Prize Money Chart 1 with \$125 for the athlete in 13th place.

6. \$34,600 Table A with jump-off - Sunday, October 2

All athletes qualified for the Grand Prix must compete with their Grand Prix horse in the initial round of at least one competition prior to the Grand Prix. Class to be run according to FEI Article 238.2.2. Maximum fence height is 1.45m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money will be awarded using the FEI Prize Money Chart 2 with \$150 for the athlete in 13th place.

Athletes are invited by the Organizer through their National Federation. One (1) groom per athlete. Max 4 starts per horse except for horses participating in the Charity class on Saturday evening (participation in the Charity class is by special invitation by the OC). There are four days for entire show. A rider and horse entered in a category (CSI 5* or CSI 2* or National classes) can only participate in the classes of this category.

Section 1 Compulsory Invitations

1.1 70% of the total number of athletes invited must be from the top 150 on the FEI World Ranking list established by the FEI two months prior to the event. The following conditions must be respected. Consequently this percentage may need to be reduced.

1.1.1 Athletes are invited in descending order from the first athlete on the FEI World Ranking list.

1.1.2 At least ten foreign NFs must be invited with at least two athletes per NF.

1.1.3. If a NF has only one athlete in the above percentage, the NF in question has the right to enter a second athlete providing he is within the top 150 on this list.

1.1.4. The Organizing committees may limit the number of athletes from a single foreign NF to five. However, they are free to accept more than five athletes from the same NF providing they are within the above percentage and providing the other NFs invited have entered a second athlete.

1.1.5. If the Organizing Committee cannot fill its quota from the top 150 on the FEI World Ranking list, vacant places will be filled by inviting athletes from 150th place on the FEI World Ranking list in descending order.

1.1.6. The total number of athletes to be invited to the event, as well as the date of the FEI World Ranking list which applies for invitation of athletes must be printed in the schedule.

1.2. If a NF is invited to send participants but decides not to participate, another NF is selected by the Organizing Committee in accordance with the conditions established for invitation of athletes in section 1.1.2.

Section 2 OC Invitations

A maximum 30% of the total number of athletes invited can be invited as wild cards by the Organizing Committee through their NFs (these may consist of foreign and/or home athletes). These athletes can be taken from any position on the FEI World Ranking list. These invitations (foreign and/or home athletes) should be under the same conditions as for other participants and cannot be granted in return for a financial contribution. At the same, it is also unacceptable for athletes to ask for an appearance fee.

1. \$9,000 Table A against the clock - Thursday, September 29

Class to be run according to FEI Article 238.2.1. Maximum fence height is 1.45m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money to be awarded according to the FEI Prize Money Chart 2 with \$100 for the 13th placed athlete.

2. \$55,000 Table A with jump-off - Friday, September 30

Class to be run according to FEI Article 238.2.2. Maximum fence height is 1.50m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money to be awarded using the FEI Prize Money Chart 2 with \$150 to the 13th placed athlete. This class counts for the Longines Rankings Group D.

3. \$95,000 Longines Speed Final - Friday, September 30

Class to be run as an International competition <<Table C>> according to FEI Article 239. Obstacles knocked down while jumping will add 2 seconds to the rider's time. The maximum fence height is 1.45m. Riders are not allowed to school their horses in this class. Riders who would like to school their horses will have the opportunities immediately after the prize ceremony.

Class is open to all CSI 5^{*} riders and the best 5 CSI 2^{*} riders of the CSI 2^{*} Competition Class no. 2 (1.45m Table A against the clock) on Thursday. If one of the 5 best CSI 2^{*} riders decides not to participate, the 6th rider will be invited. If a 2nd rider decides not to participate, the 7th rider of the competition will be invited.

The current top three during the course are required to sit on the winner's thrones which will be placed in the arena's corner. If a rider gets a better result than one of the current top three, he/she will take his/her place on the throne. The horse must be collected by the groom at the exit of the main arena and the rider must immediately take place on the winners throne. The riders who do not wish to take place on the throne will not receive their prize money. This will happen in the jump-off/2nd round of after half of the riders finished in Table C.

Prize money will be distributed according to the FEI Prize Money Chart 2 with \$175 for the 13th placed athlete. This class counts for the Longines Rankings Group C.

4. \$34,600 Table A with jump-off - Saturday, October 1

Class to be run according to FEI Article 238.2.2 with one jump off. Maximum fence height is 1.45m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. Prize money will be distributed according to the FEI Prize Money Chart 2 with \$125 for the 13th placed athlete. This class counts for the Longines Rankings Group D.

5. \$86,000 Gold Cup - Winning Round - Saturday, October 1

This class is an International Competition with one round and winning round, according to FEI Article 276.2, with the first round and winning round accumulating to penalties and time.

In this competition the best 10 athletes (at least 25% and in any case all clear rounds) of the first round qualify for the winning round, in which they start in reverse order of the results (penalties and time) of the first round. In the winning round, all athletes start with 0 penalties. Both rounds are judged under Table A against the clock. For exceeding the time allowed in the winning round athletes are penalized with one penalty point for every four seconds commenced. Athletes in the winning round are placed according to penalties and time of the winning round. Possible further placements will be done according to penalties and time in the first round. If an athlete qualified for he winning round does not start in this round, he/she will not be replaced.

There is no jump off. Maximum fence height is 1.50m/1.55m. Time allowed is calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map.

Prize money will be distributed according to FEI Prize Money Chart 2.

6. \$377,500 Longines Grand Prix - Sunday, October 2

Class to be run according to Table A with jump-off, FEI Article 238.2.2. Maximum fence height is 1.60m. Time allowed will be calculated using 350m/minute unless otherwise indicated on the course map. All athletes taking part in this Competition must compete, with their horse, the initial round of at least on competition prior to this one.

The current top three during the course are required to sit on the winner's throne which will be placed in the arena's corner. If a rider gets a better result than one of the current top three, he/she will take his/her place on the throne. The horse must be collected by the groom at the exit of the main arena and the rider must immediately take place on the winners throne. The riders who do not wish to take place on the throne will not receive their prize money. This will happen in the jump-off/2nd round or after half of the rider finished in table C.

Prize money will be distributed according to FEI Prize Money Chart 2 with \$350 for the 13th placed athlete. This class counts for the Longines Group Rankings - Group A.

The Longines Grand Prix of the Longines Masters of Los Angeles is part of the Masters Grand Slam Indoor of Show Jumping.

MASTERS GRAND SLAM INDOOR OF SHOWJUMPING

Masters Grand Slam Indoor Bonus: The OC will award a bonus for the owner of the horse(s) in the case that an athlete (not athlete/hors combination) is successful in the three successive Grand Prix. The bonus system in as follows:

- a. An athlete wins a bonus of €2,250,000 if the athlete wins all three successive Grand Prix's in a row in the following order: Grand Prix of LA, followed by the Grand Prix of Paris, followed by the Grand Prix of Hong Kong; or
- b. An athlete wins a bonus of €1,000,000 if an athlete wins all three successive Grand Prix in a row but in another order*

The bonus cycle (three consecutive events/Grand Prix) for each athlete will start the moment of her/his first win, regardless of the calendar year.

*Possibility 1 for the €1,000,000 bonus: Grand Prix of Paris, followed by the Grand Prix of Hong Kong, followed by the Grand Prix of LA; or

*Possibility 2 for the €1,000,000 bonus: Grand Prix of Hong Kong, followed by the Grand Prix of LA, followed by the Grand Prix of Paris.

ENTRIES

All competitors must submit their entry no later than **September 2, 2016**. Riders competing on two or more horses (see competition specification) with separate owners much submit separate entry forms. All horses on grounds must be registered on an entry blank including horses not entered in classes.

There are a limited number of entries for each competition. See competition specifications for details on invitations, entry restrictions and requirements. Acceptance is not confirmed until the competitor's entry and fees have been paid in full.

Entry forms must be complete with owner, rider, trainers and payee information including association membership numbers. Each entry form must be signed by the owner, rider, trainer and coach (if applicable). Said signature shall constitute verification that the information contained therein is accurate to the best of the signer's knowledge and belief. Any falsification of entry information will result in disgualification of the entry and forfeiture of the entry and fees.

All checks for entries must be made in US funds and made payable to EEM USA. Credit cards will be accepted with a completed credit card authorization form. Credit card authorization forms can be downloaded from www.LonginesMasters.com.

FEI riders in the Masters CSI 5^{*} or Prestige CSI 2^{*} competition must also be nominated by the National Federation on the FEI entry system, along with the horses they wish to compete. Deadline for the submission of entries is September 2, 2016.

Upon arrival, a Negative Coggins and Routine Health Certificate must be presented to the show secretary. See page XX for details. USEF amateur certification and membership cards or copies must be provided to the sport office before number will be released. Horses competing in FEI classes must also show their FEI Passport and registration number with name, number and correct description of horse.

Effective January 1, 2009, a \$7 USHJA Zone Support Fee is to charged to each horse entered at a Federated Licensed Hunter and/or Jumper Competition. This fee shall be collected by the competition and remitted to the USHJA in accordance with GR1210.14.

CROSS ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

Horse and riders my only enter one competition and may not cross enter into any other competition. Horse and riders competing in the National competition may compete in both height sections as long as each horse has not more than one start per day, with the exception of horses competing in the Pro-Am Style & Competition for Charity on Saturday (entry is by special invitation).

SUBSTITUTIONS

No substitutions of horses may be made after the announced closing date of entries. No horse may be withdrawn from competition in the show without permission. Exhibitors shall be held responsible for entry fees of all horses entered by them or their agents.

REFUND POLICY/SCRATCHES

Cancellations made more than one month in advance will be granted a 90% refund of the initial payment. Cancellations made with in 2-4 weeks of the event will receive a 50% refund. There will be no refund of payment for cancellations made within 2 weeks of the event.

POST ENTRIES

Post entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organizing committee.

ADDS/SCRATCHES

All adds must be made no later than 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last class of the day prior.

ORDER OF GO

There will be a posted order of go in all classes. Any anticipated scheduling conflicts should be brought to the attention of the starters who will advise you on how it will be resolved. Under no circumstances will the Horse Show be interrupted due to a competitor failing to present himself at the gate in a timely manner. Multiple rides must be shown in the correct order. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

NUMBERS

Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all MAY be eliminated from the class by the judges.

RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES AND SUPPLIES

All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier and feed/bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

RETURNED CHECKS

Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or 10% of the face value of the check- whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc. and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time.

UNPAID CHARGES

Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance will be billed for these charges and a \$50 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all further entries of rider and owner will be returned.

PRESENTATION & PRIZE MONEY

ATTIRE

Hunt coats are required in all classes.

AWARDS PRESENTATIONS

In all classes, an awards presentation will be made. Riders have to be present to accept these awards. A suitable horse should be available for classes where it is required to ride for awards.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be wired to accounts within 30 days of the show's conclusion. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID UNLESS THE OWNER'S or PAYEE'S SOCIAL SECURITY/TAX ID NUMBER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY FORM. Any prize money that is to be paid to someone other than the owner listed on the entry blank must be written on the form when submitted. The Internal Revenue Service requires that 30% of prize money won by foreign exhibitors to be withheld. California requires 7% to be withheld for state taxes. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and are required to complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form. Please refer to the FEI Definite Schedule for prize money distribution.

Prize Money Won by Foreign Competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors may request a Treaty exemption Foreign competitors requesting a treaty exemption need to have an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN), and will be required to complete either a form W-8BEN or W-8BEN-E Certificate of Foreign Status form indicating the Article number and the treaty exemption. If you do not provide us with a properly completed W-8 listing your ITIN, we are required to withhold 30% of your prize money and remit it to the IRS. Forms will be available at the show office or at <u>www.irs.gov</u>. We strongly advise competitors to consult their tax advisor in advance of the event. The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organizer before the end of the show.

PROTESTS

Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 (non-members \$300) payable to EEM USA with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing Committee, or Show

Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 & 603.1.

VETERINARY REQUIREMENTS

VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1028)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarized below.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

EXAMINATION OF ARRIVAL (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1032)

On arrival at an Event venue, all horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organizing Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

HORSE INSPECTIONS (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1033, TABLE 2)

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1034)

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination of are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)(FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS, CHAPTER VI)

SAMPLING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1057 AND 1058)

All Horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

ELECTIVE TESTING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1056)

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances. Please refer to <u>www.FEl.org/veterinary</u> for information and details.

BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS

The quarantine of the international horses will be on site, for this reason, we are obligated to require the following of the national horses prior to being unloaded at the facility. All horses stabling on the show grounds must arrive between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. If it is necessary to arrive at any other time you must contact the show office prior and check in with night security.

MANDATORY

A Current Health Certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian dated within 10 days for each horse which includes a statement that provides the last date of influenza vaccination (must be within 6 months of entrance into the facility, but not within the preceding 7 days) must be fi led with the horse show office prior to issuance of show number.

A Certificate of Vaccination for each horse must be filled with the horse show office. This document must contain certification from the person responsible that the horse has been a febrile for the 72 hours preceding shipment to the facility. The vaccination certificate must list your horse's show name and document that your horse has received regular and consistent vaccination against Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 with most recent booster being within 90 days and not within 7 days.

RECOMMENDED

You should be able to document your horse's normal temperature before arrival. Please do not ship horses with elevated temperatures. It is strongly recommended that you establish a log of temperatures taken at least twice a day. If there is an elevated temperature for more than a 24 hour period, please consult your local veterinarian immediately and report the situation to management. Isolation stalls will be available either

on the grounds or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses being shipped long distances. Extra hours on a horse van, or moving

from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horses and health of your neighbor's horses.

DRUG TESTING

FEI Drug rules will apply for the FEI Division. State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

ACCREDITATIONS

Entry right to the stable area according to FEI Veterinary Regulations Art. 1023 VI.

Free show passes will ONLY be granted if the required information has been entered into the online entry system of HIPPO BASE by the respective NF at the latest by the closing date of definite entries.

NUMBER OF ACCREDITED PERSONS:

Athlete: One (1) accreditation per athlete

Partner: One (1) guest per athlete

Groom: One (1) groom per athlete

Horse Owner: Two (2) accreditations per horse acc. to FEI-Passport

Show passes can only be picked up personally after presentation of a valid ID card. The passes must be worn at all times on the show grounds. The passes will be withdrawn if they are passed on. Entrance passes to the stable area are according to VR Art. 1005.2.5. At least one of the names of the owners must correspond with the horse Owners registered in the FEI passport of the horse (GR Art. 132.1).

The owner of the show pass accepts the show ground regulations as well as the accreditation rules of the Longines Masters of Los Angeles.

In case of loss, a new show pass will be issued for a fee of \$150.

Additional show passes for coaches, guests of riders,...are at the expense of the coach, guest,...and will only be granted if the required information has been entered into the online entry system by the respective NF at the latest by the closing date of the definite entries.

The fee for these show passes must be paid by credit card or in cash at the accreditation office when picking up the pass. Horse Owner: (2 accreditations per FEI-Passport)

VENUE INFORMATION

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

HORSES MAY NOT ARRIVE BEFORE 8:00 AM, TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27 AND MUST VACATE BY SUNDAY NIGHT OCTOBER 2 AT 8:00 PM. There is limited onsite trailer parking. Please contact Nicky Meyer, the Rider Manager to make arrangements. You must unload horses and equipment and move vans immediately.

PARKING

Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking areas in the public parking lot.

STABLING

Stabling is located in the parking lot of the Long Beach Convention Center. Stalls and tack rooms will be available for \$400.00. No bedding included. Stalls are of portable construction, 10' x 10' with top and bottom doors. Water buckets and hoses must be provided by the exhibitor. NO straw or synthetic/paper materials permitted- only wood shavings. It is strictly forbidden to remove stall doors. Exhibitors will be billed for any damage to property. Upon departure from the show, if excessive cleanup is required there will be a \$500 fee charged.

FEED AND BEDDING

Feed & bedding will be handled by the horse show office. The first 4 bags of shavings are included in the horse stall price. Please email ridersla@eemworld.com for additional bedding or with any questions regarding feed and bedding.

SAFETY REGULATIONS

Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

WASHING HORSES

Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water.

STALL CLEANING

Please deposit all manure at the ends of the barn aisles and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls.

TURNOUTS AND LUNGING

Horses may not be turned-out in arenas at any time. Lunging in designated areas only.

MEDICAL WASTE

All needles and syringes MUST be deposited in designated disposal containers and not left in stalls or thrown in trash receptacles. Violators will be fined \$75 per needle/syringe. For the first offense the trainer/owner will be notified as well as the appropriate association. The second offense will disqualify the individual and horse and they will be banished from the show with NO REFUND.

RV RESERVATIONS

RV's will not be permitted on site.

DOGS

No dogs will be allowed on site. No dogs will access the stables or the show ground.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (If your competition bans motorized vehicles, please contact our office for further instruction.)

SCHOOLING

Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF, FEI or appropriate association schooling rules. Horses competing in FEI Division may only school at posted times and in designated areas.

Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set, or when there is equipment in the ring. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show.

POLING

Poling is prohibited in the State of California. No bamboo or offsets allowed on the Showground's. Non-compliance will result in elimination from the show.

HELMET RULE

All persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. This rule, effective April 1, 2012 puts the onus on parents and trainers to make sure that all exhibitors wear one of the 65 helmets that are currently approved by the American Society of Testing Materials/Safety Equipment Institute. Under the rule, judges, stewards and show management are obligated to check out helmets they suspect may not be ASTM-SEI approved and to prevent all exhibitors from competing if the helmet does not comply with the new rule.

INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

TRANSPORTATION OF HORSES

Transportation expenses are the responsibility of the athlete. Please contact Nicky Meyer, Riders & Sport Manager for assistance coordinating transportation from Europe or the East Coast.

HORSES FROM EUROPE

Transport for the horses (maximum 2 horses per athlete) will be organized at the OC expense in normal, 'triple' stall (three horses per air stall), only from Europe, on flights designated by the OC and for limited riders appointed by the OC before the date of definite entries.

The athletes/grooms have to respect carefully the instructions and conditions of the forwarding and airfreight company appointed by the OC. Transport expenses to the designed airport in Europe have to be paid by the athlete. The OC takes care only of the transport from the designated airport to Los Angeles and return. The OC also takes care of the transport from Los Angeles International Airport to the show ground and return.

N.B. Please note that any designated rider withdrawing after the date of definitive entries or with noshows will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling, and hotel expenses). The amount charged will be \$2500 per rider in case of full cancellation. If the cancellation concerns only one of the horses, the amount to be paid is \$1000. In case of force Majeure duly proven (serious health problem concerning horse or rider) the penalties can be reconsidered by the OC.

Horses must be stabled in the stalls assigned to them on the show ground. Bedding (max. 6 bags of shavings per horse) and feed for horses is free of charge at the event. From arrival, following procedure has to be followed very strictly:

Transport of horses

The OC through their appointed agents is responsible for the airfreight costs to transport two horse per rider travelling from Europe indicated from the OC. This is providing that the horses depart from Liège to Los Angeles on flights organized by the Organising Committee. (exact dates and times to be confirmed closer to the date).

The OC will pay for all horses to travel in single stalls, three to a pallet. Should riders wish to upgrade their horses to wide stalls, two horses to a pallet they will be liable to pay the additional airfreight costs of 6000€ per horse round trip payable directly to European Horse Services.

Any rider wishing to upgrade their horses to wide stalls must make a firm and non-refundable booking by August 23, 2016 at the latest; from the August 24th onwards it will not be possible to obtain additional capacity from the airline.

Riders should note that upgrades to a wide stall will only be possible on a 'first come, first served' basis as space is limited and also on condition that there are co-loads available to share the wide stall.

Riders are responsible for all charges relating to pre-export blood testing, vaccinations and Ministry Veterinary fees to issue export health certification to Los Angeles and for transportation to/from the airport of departure.

The OC is responsible for all export and import handing charges in Liège in addition to all local charges in Los Angeles related to import, re export & transfer to/from the venue except for the Health papers.

Attendants on flights

One professional flying groom and one veterinarian will accompany the flight to and from Los Angeles. A further minimum of 4 (TBC) shippers' grooms nominated collectively be the OC will be permitted to accompany the horses on the flights.

Transport of equipment

The OC will transport 125 kgs of equipment per horse free of charge. This includes the groom's personal luggage. Any additional equipment over and above this allowance will be transported at the respective rider's expense with no guarantee that it can travel on the same flight as the horses.

Health requirements

European Horse Services will send a comprehensive memo to all riders with details of the sanitary requirements, including testing and vaccinations.

Responsibility

Neither the Organizing Committee, nor European Horse Services accepts any responsibility for any accident or illness that may befall any horse, competitor, groom or any other person. The same applies in case of damage to cars, saddler, utensils, and other objects (including damage resulting from theft, loss, fire).

NFs/riders are responsible to ensure that each participating horse is insured for a sufficient amount to cover any eventuality that can occur during or in relation to the 2016 Longines Masters of Los Angeles, including without limitations, problems during the OC organized transportation to and from the venue in LA.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore, strongly advised to take out a third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy up to date.

Dirty bedding and rubbish must be disposed in the special containers. It is absolutely forbidden to dispose the rubbish in the straw or shaving container. A penalty of \$300 will be charged when these rules are not followed.

Flights will depart from either Stewart airport in Newburgh, NY (SWF) or Newark International, NY (EWR) to Los Angeles International (LAX) or Ontario (ONT) on 26th and 27th September. Prices start at US\$ 7.750 per horse, based on a wide stall and including transfer of groom and equipment (trucking fee not included).

Please note that all transport charges will be billed by Tim Dutta Corporation and must be paid to them prior shipment. As spaces on board the aircraft are limited, reservations will be confirmed on a first-come, first-served basis.

ACCOMMODATIONS

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fi tness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. ARTICLE 1: PURPOSE
