# Marco Kutscher Creates Longines Masters History

Germany's Marco Kutscher is the toast of world show jumping after winning today's Longines Grand Prix and becoming the first rider in history to win the Grand Slam Indoor Super Bonus presented by EEM.

He is is now more than \$HK3 MILLION richer after winning today's Longines Grand Prix. In addition to his share of first prize money, Kutscher will take home a bonus cheque for 250,000 EUROS for winning a second non-consecutive Longines Grand Prix. He also triumphed in this prestigious class in

the American leg of the series last October. Kutscher, currently ranked number 18 in the world, was overjoyed with the win;

"I am now a Hong Kong millionaire," he joked.

Kutscher has been battling illness all week end and amazingly managed to get himself together for today's main event. Adding to that there was serious pressure on him going into the final round against the best of the best as he was the last rider to enter the arena and had an ominous opponent, Kevin Staut, holding the lead with a time of 46.61 sec. "I felt very anxious going out as the last rider but I have been in this position before so that experience helped me a little bit." Aboard his talented and magnificent bay stallion Van Gogh, Kutscher rode the round of his life to complete the challenging course in 45.16 sec and win his first ever bonus. "I have never won a bonus and it's not like everyday I win a Grand Prix so this is a tremendous thrill."

Winning today was an extraordinary achievement by Kutscher who is the first rider to meet the challenge of winning two out of three Longines Grand Prix events in this intercontinental series that takes place in Los Angeles, Paris and Hong Kong.

Founder of this innovative series, EEM CEO Christophe Ameeuw congratulated Kutscher for historic performance. "We are ending the fourth edition of the Longines Masters of Hong Kong on a high and it is incredible to see Marco win this Grand Slam Indoor Super Bonus and great for the public here to be able to witness history and an incredible standard of sport," Ameeuw said.

Longines Grand Prix Runner-up Kevin Staut was full of praise for Kutscher and not surprised he stole victory in the last round. "The way Marco performed in the opening round I knew it was going to be very hard to beat him," Staut said. Italy's Emanuele Gaudiano finished third (46.74 sec), current world number 2 Simon Delestre from France was fourth placed (46.76 sec) and Irish young gun Bertram Allen (47.11 sec) was fifth.

# Jacqueline Lai launches her International Showjumping Career at Longines Masters of Hong Kong

Hong Kong's star rider Jacqueline Lai gave the Hong Kong JETS a special Masterclass today. With strong support from her home crowd Lai rode in great form during her first ever CSI 5 \* event. She finished 20th in today's Longines Grand Prix which is the best finishing effort by a Hong Kong rider in this class since the event's inception four years ago.

# Massimo Dutti Trophy

Popular French rider Roger Yves Bost broke through for a win in today's Massimo Dutti Trophy, 1m45 Against the Clock. Riding 11 year-old gelding Record d'Oreal, Bosty recorded a time of 54.87 sec to snare victory much to the delight of the crowd who have become big fans of the champion rider since he first began competing at the Longines Masters of Hong Kong four years ago. Shortly after his victory Bosty met his many fans for a signature session inside the Massimo Dutti boutique in the Prestige Village. In the Massimo Dutti Trophy he defeated Switzerland's Pius Schwizer (55.59 sec). Shwizer has had an outstanding show so far without winning. Last night he placed third in the Longines Speed Challenge behind Ireland's Betram Allen and earlier that day he was second in the Airbus Trophy won by British legend John Whitaker. Shwizer will be hoping to break through for a much deserved first win of the show in today's Longines Grand Prix aboard PSG Future. Based on his current strong form, many believe he has a strong chance of winning the feature event of the Longines Masters of Hong Kong. Current FEI World Number 2 Simon Delestre finished third in today's Massimo Dutti Trophy riding Stardust Quinhon. If he manages to win today's Longines Grand Prix there is a possibility he will become number 1. At the Longines Masters of Paris in December he finished second in the Longines Grand Prix to Patrice Delaveau.

The inaugural Shanghai Tang Polo Cup was also decided after a three-day contest between four 4-aside teams of celebrity polo players and eight horses from the Chantilly Polo Club in France.

It was a thrilling contest between star polo players from three continents including French No. 1 Brieuc Rigaux, Australian champion Dirk Gould, Great Britain's Malcolm Borwick and Argentinean star Nico Curto. The fast-paced, dynamic spectacle marked the historic return of the 'Sport of Kings' to Hong Kong for the first time in 30 years, sponsored by luxury lifestyle brand Shanghai Tang.

The star-studded red carpet had crowds rushing to greet their favourite star, Aaron Kwok, Longines Ambassador of Elegance. For two successive victories, the rider will be awarded €500,000, and winners of two non-successive victories within a series of three Longines Masters Grand Prix will receive a €250,000 bonus.

These events are broadcast in more than 120 countries and reach up to 550 million households. Every edition of the Longines Masters is a must-attend event that brings together sports enthusiasts, amateurs, celebrities and corporate decision-makers from around the world, who come to enjoy a unique experience, boasting exceptional sport, entertainment, glamour, gastronomy and contemporary art.
